Psalm 135

Evening Prayer Friday Week 3 verses 1-12 Morning Prayer Monday Week 4

This is an invitation to the assembly to praise YHWH, the Creator and Liberator of his people, Israel. The lack of any mention of a king suggests it is post-exilic. It abounds in quotations and traditional statements of faith.

Praying it as Christians we think of the risen Jesus; his power in creation (see John 1:3) and in liberation (see Matthew 28:18).

He was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord.

- Romans 1:4

He must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet.

- 1Corinthians 15:25

The invitation to join in praising YHWH is followed by an expression of faith in the fact that Israel is precious to YHWH. 'Treasured possession' in verse 4 translates the Hebrew segull≠ [מַנֶּלָה], which occurs only here in the psalms and only 8 times in the Hebrew Bible. The classical text is in the Book of Exodus:

If you obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession out of all the peoples.

- Exodus 19:5

You are a people holy to YHWH your God; YHWH your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on earth to be his people, his treasured possession.

– Deuteronomy 7:6 (14:2)

Today YHWH has obtained your agreement: to be his treasured people, as he promised you, and to keep his commandments.

– Deuteronomy 26:18

They shall be mine, says YHWH of hosts, my special possession on the day when I act, and I will spare them as parents spare their children who serve them.

- Malachi 3:17

The other two texts are Ecclestiastes 2:8 and 1Chronicles 29:3. It speaks of something personal and something especially treasured by the owner.

¹Praise YH! [Hal^elû Yâ] Praise the name of YHWH*; praise him, O servants of YHWH,

²you that stand in the house of YHWH, in the courts of the house of our God.

³Praise YH, for YHWH is good; sing to his name, for he is gracious*.

⁴For YHWH chooses Jacob for himself, Israel as his own treasured possession.

⁵I know that YHWH is great; our Lord, the greatest of the gods.

'Now I know that YHWH is greater than all gods' (Jethro - Exodus 18:11)

⁶Whatever YHWH wants to do he does, in heaven and on earth, in the sea and in the deep. ⁷He brings the clouds up from the horizon; he scatters the rain with lightning, and brings out the wind from his storehouses.

'He makes the mist rise from the ends of the earth. He makes lightnings for the rain, and he brings out the wind from his storehouses' (Jeremiah 10:13)

⁸He struck down the first born of Egypt, human beings and animals alike;

'YHWH struck down all the first born in the land of Egypt' (Exodus 12:29).

9he sent signs and wonders into your midst, O Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his servants. 10He struck down many nations and killed mighty kings – 11Sihon, king of the Amorites, and Og, king of Bashan, and all the kings of Canaan.

¹²He gave their land as a heritage, a heritage to his people Israel.

¹³Your name, YHWH, endures forever,
your renown, YHWH, throughout all ages.

¹⁴For YHWH will vindicate his people, and have compassion on his servants.

'YHWH will vindicate his people, and have compassion on his servants.' (Deuteronomy 32:36)

¹⁵The idols of the nations are silver and gold, the work of human hands.

¹⁶They have mouths, but they do not speak;

they have eyes, but they do not see;

¹⁷they have ears, but they do not hear,
and there is no breath in their mouths.

¹⁸Those who make them and all who trust them shall become like them.
