This is an invitation to praise YHWH because of who YHWH is – a God who cares for those who place their trust in him.

¹Praise YH! [Halêlû Yâ]!

Praise YHWH*, O my soul*!

²I will praise YHWH as long as I live; I will sing praises to my God all my life long.

The psalmist begins by calling on others to praise YHWH, and then immediately gives the same instruction to himself, telling himself to praise God from the depths of his being (his *nepeš*). See the article ‘Being’ in the Introduction.

I will sing to YHWH as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have breath to do so.

– Psalm 104:33

³Do not put your trust* in princes, in mortal human beings, in whom there is no help*.

‘Mortal human beings’ are those who come from *’ādām*, and so from the *’adāmā* (the ‘earth’, see verse 4), to which they must return.

Thus says YHWH: ‘Cursed are those who trust in mere mortal human beings and make mere flesh their strength, whose hearts turn away from YHWH. Blessed are those who trust in YHWH, whose trust is YHWH.’

– Jeremiah 17:5,7

O grant us help against the foe, for human help is of no avail. With God we shall do valiantly; it is he who will tread down our foes.

– Psalm 60:11-12

It is better to take refuge in YHWH than to put confidence in human beings. It is better to take refuge in YHWH than to put confidence in princes.

– Psalm 118:8-9

⁴When their breath departs, they return to the earth; on that very day their plans come to nothing.

Humans, made of earth a short time before, after a little while go to the earth from which all are taken, when the time comes to return the borrowed souls.

YHWH

1. who keeps faith forever.

This is the first of ten qualities which the psalmist attributes to YHWH. We are told that God keeps faith for ever. This means that God will keep all the promises he has ever made to you and to your children and to the world. We will never be without God's love, no matter how dark the road may seem. Can we believe this when things are going hard for us? Sometimes we have found ourselves unable to keep promises we have made - and sometimes it is because the promises turned out to be un- wisely made. Sometimes circumstances that are too complex to unravel have simply brought us to exhaustion and we have had to let promises go. Could we look at the central promises that are still functioning in our lives? Relying on God's grace could we ask to be more open to the Spirit which God is certainly offering us to find more effective ways of keeping the promises which we made in baptism and confirmation to carry on Jesus' mission of love in this world.

2. 'who executes right judgment* for the oppressed*.

If we believe that God executes right judgment for the oppressed, then a lot of people must not be listening or responding to grace. If we were, the world would not be such an unjust place. Is God asking me or you to reach out in one or other area of oppression and do what we can, always respecting persons and in love, to put injustices right? Little help is gained by being overwhelmed by a huge list. God is the one who is just to the oppressed, so the real question is: Is God inspiring me, or us as a community, to do something in a specific area. If so am I willing to listen and to begin responding? Luke chooses the following text to set out the essence of Jesus' mission:

The spirit of the Lord YHWH is upon me,
because YHWH has anointed me;
he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed,
to bind up the brokenhearted,
to proclaim liberty to the captives,
and release to the prisoners.

– Isaiah 61:1 (= Luke 4:17-18)

3. who gives food to the hungry.

Jesus gave food to the hungry (See Mark 6:34-44; Matthew 25:35-40). Can we love God without sharing his longing to reach out to meet people's hunger - for bread, for love, for a listening ear, for dignity, for a place and a home?

4. YHWH sets prisoners free.

See Jesus' example (Matthew 4:16; Luke 13:16). If so many people are locked into racism and prejudice and destructive addictions, and inability to forgive, it is not because grace is lacking. It must be because so many are insensitive to grace and failing to respond to the inspiration of God's loving Spirit to go out and help unlock the prisons that we create in our fear.

Jesus caused the 'blind' to 'see' (Matthew 9:30; 11:5; 20:29-34).

Thus says God, YHWH, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: I am YHWH, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.

– Isaiah 42:5-7

I will lead the blind by a road they do not know, by paths they have not known I will guide them. I will turn the darkness before them into light, the rough places into level ground. These are the things I will do, and I will not forsake them.

– Isaiah 42:16

Bring forth the people who are blind, yet have eyes, who are deaf, yet have ears!

– Isaiah 43:8

YHWH is faithful in all his words,
and gracious in all his deeds.
YHWH upholds all who are falling,
and raises up all who are bowed down.
