Spiritual Works of Mercy

- acts of compassion to help our neighbours in emotional and spiritual need.

counsel the doubtful instruct the ignorant admonish sinners comfort the afflicted forgive offenses bear wrongs patiently




pray for the living and the dead







Ps I If you want to be open to God's blessing do not follow those whose hearts have no place for God. Do not linger in the way of sinners, or sit and scoff with cynics.

They will have no place among the just. The Lord looks with love on the way of the just. The way of sinners leads only to destruction.




Joseph does not embody the form of externalised legalism that Jesus denounces in Mt 23 and that Paul opposes strenuously.


We ought to pray so powerfully that we should like to put our every member and strength, our two eyes and ears, mouth, heart and all our senses to work;


and we should not give up until we find that we wish to be one with the one who is present to us and whom we entreat, namely God.




The Escape to Egypt

"Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." Mt 2:14










Joseph's discernment
